In 1979 Mother Teresa (Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhia) won the Nobel Prize for Peace. This book tells about her life-long work with poor people and how she finally was famous.

The story starts with her childhood in Yugoslavia, her native country. She was born in 1910. At the age of 18 she decided to become a nun. She lived very simply and worked very hard.

The Nobel Prize included a lot of money. She used the money to continue her noble actions.

She died in September 1997.

Nowadays there are hundreds of sisters all over the world, including Chile, serving the poor thanks to Mother Teresa's initiative.
